## **DEPARTMENT OF OBSTETRICS AND GYNECOLOGY ORGANIZES INTERNATIONAL UROGYNAEC WORKSHOP UNDER THE AEGIS OF FOGSI**

The department of Obstetrics and Gynecology under the leadership of Prof. Vineet Mishra had organized an International Urogynecology conference from November 15<sup>th</sup> – 17<sup>th</sup>, 2013 under the aegis of Federation of Obstetric and Gynaecological Societies of India (FOGSI). Live operative workshop was conducted on November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2013 at IKDRC. There were 24 faculty members who performed different surgeries in this workshop in 4 major theatres and 250 delegates had registered for this workshop. The surgeries performed included laparoscopic hysterectomy, myomectomy, vaginal hysterectomy, TVT, TOT, mesh cystoplasty, robotic ureteric implantation and a sling surgery. Our own urologist including Prof. Dr. Pranjal Modi performed robotic ureteric Reimplantation and Dr. Jamal Rizvi demonstrated cystoscopy in this workshop. On November 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>, 2013 the conference was held at Grand Cambay and 450 delegates had attended it.

As usual the year end celebrations were organized to sum up the performance of the institute and each department in the presence of Shree Rajesh Kishoreji, Principal Secretary, Dept of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of Gujarat who is also the Chairman of the institute. Shri Rasikbhai Mehta, member of the Institutional Review Board and Governing Body also was kind enough to remain present on this occasion. This year the function was organized on 31<sup>st</sup> December in evening hours and was followed by traditional dinner enjoyed by all. Dr. Kalpana Vora presented on behalf of Anesthesia department, Dr. Guruprasad Bhosale presented the performance of CCU, Dr. Vineet Mishra showed the performance

of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Dr. Vaibhav Sutaria talked about Gastrointestinal Surgery and Liver Transplantation, Dr. Pankaj Shah presented about Nephrology and Clinical Transplantation, Dr. Dinesh Gera talked about Pediatric Nephrology, Dr. Harda Shah presented the performance of Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation department, Dr. Shruti Gandhi evaluated the performance of Radiology department, Dr. Rashmi Patel evaluated the performance of department of Pathology, Lab Medicine, Transfusion Services and Immunohematology and Dr. Jamal Rizvi evaluated the performance of Urology and Transplantation. He showed that this year the work on pediatric urology had escalated with the kind support of the government of Gujarat. At the end Dr. Aruna Vanikar, Prof. and HOD of Pathology, Lab Medicine, Transfusion Services and Immunohematology presented the milestones achieved by the institute in 2013. This year was special for all since we created world record of performing 400 kidney transplants and broke our own record of 321 kidney transplants performed in a single year. **We also created our own record of 56 kidney paired donations this year, the highest number in India! Special achievements of the year include development of robotic kidney transplantation pioneered by Prof. Pranjal Modi. He is the first surgeon in the world who has finished 51 robotic kidney transplants in a year! This year was also special since we established T-regulatory cell therapy in transplantation and autoimmune diseases along with excellent results of insulin secreting cells for diabetics who undergo combined insulin-secreting, T-reg therapy and stem cell therapy with kidney transplantation. Prof. Aruna Vanikar has been inducted in the 5 member team of Advisory Board of World Transplant Congress scheduled in San Francisco, USA in July 2014.**

### **BEST WORKER OF THE YEAR 2013**

**Chirag Rashikbhai Parmar And Prahlad Shankarbhai Makwana**, serving the institute in the capacity of Operation theatre servants were honored as Best workers of the year 2013, for their tireless services in OT specially taking care of cadaver organ transplants in addition to their strenuous regular duties. The new world record of 400 kidney transplants set this year was with joint efforts of the institute staff with special efforts of these 2 boys working like commandos! Another special person who deserves a note is our **Systems Manager Shri Yazdi P. Wadia** who has helped achieve the institute by working relentlessly day and night for months together in establishing and rolling down smoothly the hospital computer system and that too at much lower financial budget! He was also honored with the award of "Best Worker of The Year 2013". This award consists of a citation, shawl and a silver medallion! This year medallion was added up and hence all the members who were honored so far were called and given away the silver medallion.

At the end of the sessions, all the staff members and residents who had their papers published in indexed journals or had reviewed articles for different journals were awarded cash prizes. This year there were 81 publications from different departments. Dr. Vivek Kute bagged the highest prize money of Rs. 100,000/-.

## DECEASED DONOR ORGAN TRANSPLANTATION

**1. Smt. Binaben Ajaybhai Desai** was a 53 years old lady from Surat. She had lost her husband in the year 2000. Her two daughters are happily married and her son with whom she was living, is serving as an engineer in a German company. On 20<sup>th</sup> October, she suddenly started vomiting, had dizziness and excruciating headache which was followed by unconsciousness. She was also suffering from cirrhosis of liver for several years for which she was taking medications. This must have led to a bleeding episode causing brain hemorrhage. She was taken to Mahavir hospital under the care of Dr. Kirit Shah who explained to the family that the damage in brain was beyond repair. The Neurophysicians Aniruddha Apte and Satyavani after examining her, declared her brain dead. The relatives were already well-informed about

brain death and they had already planned for eye donation in case the situation worsened. Hence they quickly agreed for donation of other organs as well. Our team was summoned and procured her organs. One kidney was donated to Mr Shashikant Rana, 59 years old hypertensive patient with kidney failure from Surat, who was on our waiting list for the last 3 years. He was a government employee. Unfortunately he died within 24 hours of transplantation due to massive heart attack. The second kidney was given to 32 years old Pratik Kanani from Jamnagar, suffering from hypertension associated CRF and was on our waiting list for the last 1.5 years. Pratik is jobless. Unfortunately this graft also did not work and was removed after 1 month. These transplants were performed on **22<sup>nd</sup> October.**

**2. Smt Nirmaladevi Saraf** was a 70 years old lady from Surat. She belonged to a family of property dealers. She was suffering from arthritis for the last 10 years for which she was taking some medication. She had been gradually deteriorating in health with breathlessness for the last few days before she was taken to Mahavir hospital on 29<sup>th</sup> September. While she was admitted there, the family had been closely watching the

progression of health deterioration, brain death and subsequent procedure of organ donation of Binaben Desai. Her grandson staying in Delhi had once discussed with her about organ donation. She had already told him that if she was ever declared brain dead, she would like her organs to be donated to a needy patient. On 15<sup>th</sup> October, she had cardiac arrest and was revived. She was subsequently kept on mechanical ventilator. Thus when she started deteriorating, the family came forth for organ donation. Our team was summoned and procured her organs. One kidney was donated to 32 years old Milanbhai Patel hailing from a prosperous farmer's family from Surat who had lost his first kidney received from mother and transplanted in 2003 in our institute. He was on our waiting list for the last 2.5 years. Unfortunately this graft had to be removed immediately. The second kidney was given to 46 years old Hasmukhbhai Jhala serving Gujarat government in Vadodara, suffering from hypertension associated CRF and was on our waiting list for the last 1.5 years. Unfortunately this graft also did not work and was removed within 1 month. These transplants were performed on **24<sup>th</sup> October.**

**3. Smt. Hemali Dhansukhbhai Bhavsar** a 25 years old lady from Bardoli, Surat had been diagnosed to have cerebral aneurysm about 8 years back in Civil hospital, Ahmedabad. She was under a regular treatment of Dr. Prashant Patel in Surat. On 22<sup>nd</sup> November, she suddenly started projectile vomiting for which she was admitted to Sardar hospital in Bardoli. Unfortunately she deteriorated in spite of treatment there. On reaching Pravar hospital to consult Dr. Prashant Patel, she was found to be brain dead on MRI. The family was explained about her condition and was motivated for organ donation. Our team was summoned for organ procurement. One kidney was given to 28 years old Rajnibhai Gajera, a labourer from Amreli, who was previously transplanted in our institute with mother's kidney in January, 2011 for CGN-CRF. He was on our waiting list for the last 1.25 years. The other kidney was

given to 48 years old farmer Jivrajbhai Sheta from Bhavnagar who was on our waiting list for the last 2 years. Liver was given to Khemchandbhai Shankarlal Soni, 60 years old man suffering from hepatitis induced cirrhosis and was on our waiting list for the last 2 months. These transplants were performed on **24<sup>th</sup> November** and all are doing well.

**4. Shree Kanubhai Mathurdas Patel** was a 52 years old man originally from village Ridrol, Vijapur district settled in Ahmedabad as a hardware businessman. On 28<sup>th</sup> November, he was going to Dehgam on bike for his business in the morning hours. Suddenly a stray dog came on his way and to save this dog, his vehicle slipped and lost his balance. His head hit the road divider and left him unconscious on the spot on highway. The passing vehicles and people saw him around 11 am in morning and called 108 ambulance service. They took him to Gandhinagar Civil

hospital and then to Ahmedabad Civil hospital under trauma care division. Unfortunately he did not have a mobile with him and there was no way to contact his family immediately. Thus people looked up in papers in his pockets and eventually located his family in Ahmedabad. He was moved to Apollo hospital near Bhat village where Dr. Dipak Malhotra operated upon him. However the family was explained about his deteriorating condition. One of the family members, Dr. Paresb Patel was a medical doctor. He and another family member Paritosh Patel explained Kanubhai's son Bhaumesh about organ donation and motivated him to donate his father's organs to patients on waiting list who were in need of organs. He was moved to our institute and eventually when his condition deteriorated further his organs were retrieved. One kidney was donated to Jitendrabhai Brahmabhatt, 49 years old man from Ahmedabad who had undergone stem cell therapy for IgA nephropathy 5 years

back. However gradually his kidneys failed and was on our waiting list for the last 6 months. The second kidney was given to 55 years old Atulbhai Shah suffering from diabetes induced kidney failure for last few years and was on our waiting list for the last 2.5 years. Liver was given to 38 years old Dharmeshbhai Ranpara suffering from hepatitis-B induced cirrhosis and was on our waiting list for the last 2 months. These transplants were performed on **1<sup>st</sup> December**. All are doing well.

**5. Smt. Manokamnaben Ramgopal Khandelwal** was a 48 years old lady from Surat. Her husband has business of some transport work. On 1<sup>st</sup> December at night, she was going with her husband, pillion riding with him to a Ganesh temple. On her way back home from the temple, she slipped off the vehicle and was seriously injured. She was immediately taken to Apple hospital in Surat itself under the care of Dr. Ashok Patel. While shifting her to the hospital she had already developed cardiac arrest once. On reaching the hospital, she

again had arrested, developed brain death and was kept on ventilator. The relatives were themselves motivated for organ donation and approached hospital authorities for organ donation of Manokamaben. Our team was summoned for organ procurement. The kidneys were given to 59 years old Bhupatbhai Magukiya, a farmer from Bhavnagar, who was suffering from diabetes induced CRF and was on our waiting list for the last 2.5 years. Liver was given to 47 years old Nagaraj Pawar, suffering from hepatitis-B induced cirrhosis and was on our waiting list for the last 2 months. These transplants were performed on **4<sup>th</sup> December**. Nagrajbhai unfortunately died on 31<sup>st</sup> December, while Bhupatbhai is doing well.

**6. Rahul Devipujak** was a young boy of 11 years studying in 4<sup>th</sup> standard, in a small village called Laakhankaa in Bhavnagar district. The family is of laborers, from economically deprived strata. On 20<sup>th</sup> December, the boy had dizziness, vomiting and fell down unconscious in school. Till that day he was fine

and even on that day he had gone to school like every day after having meals. He was taken to Sutaria hospital in Vallabhipur where his condition was found serious and the family was advised to move him to Sir T. hospital in Bhavnagar. There Dr. Kabaria, the treating Neurosurgeon, performed MRI and found a large brain tumor. Unfortunately he could not be operated upon successfully and was declared brain dead. His elder brother Pratap is 18 years old and is aware of organ donation. So he came forth for organ donation and motivated the family for the same. Our team was summoned for organ retrieval. One kidney was donated to 10 years old Yashvi Trivedi from Ahmedabad studying in 5<sup>th</sup> standard. She had lost her kidneys to reflux nephropathy induced CRF and was on our waiting list for 1.5 years. The second kidney and pancreas were given to Bhartiben Thakkar suffering from type 1 DM with kidney failure and was on our waiting list for the last 5 months. These transplants were performed on **25<sup>th</sup> December**. Yashvi has recovered but organs had to be removed from Bhartiben.
