# Foundation (TRF)

## FUND DEVELOPMENT

Rotary year 2018-19 has come to a close. We cannot help but admire the enthusiasm across the Districts in promoting Foundation. While the final TRF report on contribution for the year is still being compiled, we have received contributions over USD 20 million in South Asia region, which includes USD 1 million towards Polio from the Aditya Birla Group, thanks to Smt Rajashree Birla. India is expected to end as World No.2 in total TRF Contributions in RY 2018-19 for the fourth consecutive year. As per the interim reports, number 1 and 2 position in total contribution to TRF by Districts are likely to be Indian districts. During the year, India has made 13 AKS members and 62 Directed gifts.

This ensures them access to reports and information that can help with all your efforts. To report these appointments, you can sign in to My Rotary, go to "Manage", then select the District Administration tab.

### Major Donor Recognition Guidelines

In view of several instances of non-adherence to guidelines for Major Donor and Major Gifts Recognition in the region, the policy is being reiterated here:

- 1) Because contributions accumulate, donors may be recognized as they reach each successive level.
- 2) All outright **personal** contributions including Annual Fund, Endowment Fund, and other restricted gifts to The Rotary Foundation qualify for Major Donor recognition.
- 3) Major Donor recognition is reserved for individuals, couples, non-Rotary affiliated Foundation, and corporations. Contributions from donor spouses are typically combined for Major Donor recognition purposes. A club or district is not eligible for this recognition.

Please ensure that all Major Donor contributions, including AKS contributions are the **personal** gifts of the donors and that District Funds or contributions from any fundraising activities, beneficiaries/cooperating organizations are not being utilized to match their contributions for major donor recognitions.

## AREAS OF FOCUS GUIDELINES

Rotary is dedicated to six areas of focus to build international relationships, improve lives, and create a better world. Through global grants, awarded by The Rotary Foundation, clubs and districts participate in strategically focused, high-impact activities in these areas. All global grant activities are required to align with the goals of an area of focus.

In this edition, we are providing the guidelines which would serve as a guide when applying for a) [Basic Education and Literacy](#) and b) [Disease Prevention and Treatment global grants](#). These provide detailed information on how to make your projects sustainable, what information is required for specific project types, and where to find additional resources.

We will be sharing two areas of focus guidelines for Global Grant funding every month through our newsletter.

## TERMS & CONDITIONS FOR ROTARY FOUNDATION DISTRICT GRANTS & GLOBAL GRANTS

It is recommended to go through the [terms and conditions](#) before applying for a District or Global grant. It is important and mandatory to know the procedures and eligibility criteria before applying for a grant so that the clubs and district comply with the Foundation policies and guidelines.

## GLOBAL GRANT CALCULATOR

Many clubs and districts have been facing difficulty in calculating the funding options in the application. To easily calculate the funding options from different sources, Foundation has prepared a [Global grant calculator](#), which would help figure out whether the funding is as per the Foundation guidelines. It would automatically calculate the TRF match (DDF 1:1 / cash 1:.5), 30% minimum contribution from International partner, threshold of USD15000 as TRF match etc.

## CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY (CSR) CORNER

Rotary Foundation (India) has received total CSR funds of US\$ 1.6 million in RY 2018-19 from 27 corporates. Thanks to Districts 3000,3011,3012,3120,3131,3141,3142 and 3232 for their persistent efforts in approaching corporates, building partnerships and implementing humanitarian projects.

Rotary International District 3131 organized Rotary CSR Awards with the support of Economic Times to recognize and appreciate good work done by companies in the area of Social Wellbeing. Winner companies were felicitated for their CSR projects. The awards were given in the categories of Manufacturing, Services and Financial Institutions covering SMEs as well as large corporations. SAO staff Sanjay Parmar and Bhawna Verma attended this event.

## WASH-IN-SCHOOLS TARGET CHALLENGE

Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM) is a core component of the WASH in Schools Target Challenge program. As with many sensitive aspects of the subject, the issue of safe disposal cannot be undermined when we look at the MHM value chain.

The Swachh Bharat Mission's publication (attached) on menstrual waste management as a component of the Solid Liquid Resource Management (SLRM) vertical of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan guidelines, will come in handy as we plan and execute MHM interventions in our schools. It is quite an exhaustive document but clearly gives options, alternatives and associated costs throughout the *MHM program life cycle* – awareness, access, use, disposal and treatment. Most importantly, there are sections like 'What is informed choice on MHM products', 'Availability', 'MHM policy framework' etc. This will be highly helpful while talking with relevant stakeholders on the MHM plan, which is a Target Challenge Star One requirement.

This particular publication along with the [National Guidelines on MHM](#) help set the bigger picture as well as talk about specifics useful in implementation. This is a useful aid for reference and please feel free to share within your districts.

Here's a brief [MHM mini-toolkit for schools](#) which is an open resource on the web and talks about:

- (i) An exhaustive MHM checklist in schools – elements of a good school MHM program. It includes not just awareness generating and taboo-breaking conversations (ToT and peer-to-peer) or hardware needs, but also revenue generation for continued long-term support on menstrual hygiene for students and teachers. Again, this will be very useful in firming up the MHM plan while giving cues to stakeholders and obtaining inputs from them.
- (ii) How to make your own reusable sanitary pads – a simple step-by-step approach.

RISAO will be happy to organize online discussions with the WinS teams from your respective districts on this subject and how we can incorporate the content in our school programs.

Please do share any useful educational materials which are being used in MHM programming in schools in your regions.

## Financial Services (FS)

### RI EXCHANGE RATE – REVISED POLICY

Beginning 1 July 2019, Rotary exchange rates will be based on the prevailing market rate as of the first of each month. As a result, it will no longer be possible to send the Rotary exchange rates in advance. While it is understood that is a departure from its previous practice but believe that this is best way to provide a true exchange rate to its constituents across the globe. ### JULY 2019 INVOICE

- Electronic invoices will be sent to clubs by third week of July 2019.
- Clubs that have not yet opted out from paper invoice will receive paper invoice by early August 2019.
- Clubs are billed for all active members as of 1 January and 1 July and are required to pay the amount that appears on the invoice. It is essential to keep your club's member data current so you receive a correct invoice as these changes can no longer be made retroactively.

In case clubs want to go paperless, please check the box under Club Administration Invoice preference at My Rotary.

### ROTARY CITATION'S FY 2020 CLUB DUES PAYMENT REQUIREMENTS:

To be eligible for Rotary Citation, one of the criteria is that club must pay all dues within 60 days of date of invoice. Also, the benefit of \$50 grace balance has been eliminated.

**To verify whether the club is in good standing or not, log-in to My Rotary and navigate as follows:** Click [Manage > Club and District Administration > Club Administration > Club Finances > Daily club balance report](#). Here, the balance of the club should be "Zero"

### TERMINATED CLUBS

Clubs that have been terminated for non-payment of January 2019 dues are required to fulfill following compliances for re-instatement within 150 days of date of termination:

- Pay all outstanding financial obligations at the time of termination.
- Pay all membership dues that continue to accrue thereafter.
- Pay a \$30 per member reinstatement fee plus service tax @18%
- Reinstatement application + Active membership list.

**After 150 days from the termination date, clubs are permanently terminated and cannot be reinstated.**

## PAYMENT INSTRUCTIONS FOR RI DUES FOR CLUBS IN INDIA:

- Clubs must make online payment of their dues by using 'Bank/ Electronic Transfer' details mentioned in their respective invoice which are club specific and for club dues only. Kindly remember that information/details given in the previous invoice do not stand good now and would lead to non-payment and inconvenience.

## PAYMENT INSTRUCTIONS FOR RI NON-CLUB DUES IN INDIA

**(FOR CHARTER FEES OF NEW ROTARY CLUB/ROTARACT CLUB & REGISTRATION FEE FOR RI CONVENTION):**

- Online payment of non-club dues, along with Goods & Service Tax (GST) can be made by obtaining 'Bank/ Electronic Transfer' details from SAO staff. Once payment is done, please share the transactions details with SAO for information and records.
- For payment by cheque/demand draft, it should be drawn in favor of 'Rotary International South Asia Office', payable at New Delhi and sent to South Asia Office along with copy of application. Payment should be inclusive of Goods & Services Tax (GST).

## PAYMENT INSTRUCTIONS FOR TRF DONATIONS/CONTRIBUTIONS:

### a) **Online Giving by Donors in India**

Rupee-enabled online giving is available to donors in India both through the Rotary Foundation (India) [RF(I)] website [www.rotaryfoundationindia.org](http://www.rotaryfoundationindia.org) and Rotary International website [www.rotary.org](http://www.rotary.org).

### b) **Donation/Contribution through Cheque/Demand Draft**

- Draw a cheque/demand draft in favor of '**Rotary Foundation (India)**' payable at New Delhi and dispatch it at following address:

- The donor's name (i.e. drawer of cheque/remitter of bank draft) should be clearly mentioned along with donor's address and his/her Permanent Account Number (PAN) in the contribution form/letter.
- A single receipt per cheque will be issued in favor of the drawer of the cheque.

- A single receipt for each demand draft/pay order will be issued in favor of the remitter/purchaser, if mentioned in face of the demand draft/pay order, otherwise it will be as requested in the cover letter.

All contributions in Indian Rupees, including online contributions, will be eligible for benefits under Section 80G of Income Tax Act.

### **c) Net Banking transfers by Donors in India**

Dedicated Bank Accounts, specific to each district in India, have been opened wherein any donor from that particular district will be able to transfer funds through Net Banking. Bank Account details for making contributions through Net Banking are available with the respective District Governors. Once the money is transferred to the designated account, the UTR number of the transaction, donor name, membership ID, fund designation and the duly filled in contribution form must be forwarded to [Neelu.Kaushik@rotary.org](mailto:Neelu.Kaushik@rotary.org). In the absence of these details, it will not be possible to credit the amount to Donor's Rotary account.

## **THE GOODS & SERVICE TAX (GST)**

Clubs that have already got themselves registered or are in the process of getting registered, are requested to send following details through their registered email ID to [Sumit.Sharma@rotary.org](mailto:Sumit.Sharma@rotary.org)

### **Details required:**

- Club Name and Club Number
- Special Status (if applicable) along with supporting document issued by competent authorities (for e.g.: SEZ exemptions)
- Copy of registration certificate, duly attested by account signatories

There is a critical provision in GST that mandates the "state" code of your GST registration and the "state" of your mailing address available with the SAO to be identical. In case they are different, we request you to update mailing address of the club in RI records to comply with the above requirement.

**Under the go green initiative, FS Team is sending receipts for all RI dues & contributions electronically. Therefore, we request the club officers/Rotarians/donors to kindly update their email ids at MyRotary or mail the request to [data@rotary.org](mailto:data@rotary.org) and give us the opportunity to serve you better.**

## NEW ROTARY YEAR 2018-19: Storytelling through INSTAGRAM

As we embark on the new Rotary year, we bring to you, key tips to tell Rotary stories on a fresh platform – 'Instagram'. The platform is growing increasingly popular in our region, at times, giving a serious competition to even engagement on older platforms like Facebook. Keeping up with all the changes to social media can be challenging. Instagram stories are one exciting feature that even Rotary International's Social media team is using actively.

**What are Instagram stories:** Instagram stories are any piece of vertical content, either a photo or video or text, that disappear about 24 hours after you create it, similar to Snapchat. You can extend how long a story is viewable by adding it to your highlights. Stories tend to get more engagement than your regular grid posts, making them a powerful publicity tool.



### Here's how you do it:

- First, open up the Instagram app on your mobile. (If not already installed, it can be downloaded from the Apple App Store, Google Play for Android, or App for Windows Phone Store.
- Click either the camera icon or the Your Story profile near the top of your screen.
- Select a photo from your existing gallery (icon on the bottom left), take a new photo or video, or scroll through the options at the bottom of your screen to add "type." You may have noticed that in addition to type, there are other options you can select such as Rewind, which allows you to play videos in reverse; and Boomerang, which captures a short burst of video and loops it backwards and forwards

### Enhance your story:

Now that you have your desired content, click on the square smiley face in the upper right to bring up a variety of additional features that will enhance your story. Here are a few creative ones to try:

- Poll – good for having your followers cast a vote. For eg, in a recent story, RI had followers choose between their interest in different types of Rotarian fellowships like surfing vs. yoga or cycling vs. chess.
- Questions – good for getting follower feedback or crowd sourcing opinions. RI uses this feature ahead of live interviews like with President Barry Rassin to gather questions Rotarians would like to ask him on camera.
- Gif – there's a gif for almost any search term. RI particularly uses gifs to animate photos; for instance: adding bicycle gifs to the Miles to End Polio story made those photos come to life.
- Countdown – get your followers excited with a countdown to big events like the Rotary Convention, district conferences, or even your next club meeting. RI entered 1 June for Rotary's annual convention and it auto calculates how many days are left from now until then!
- Hashtag – be sure to include #peopleofaction in your stories as part of RI's public image campaign. The social team monitors new uses of the hashtag to look for club content to re-post. But if you don't tag your work, RI won't be able to see it.
